


Meeting Notes

Peter and Jon Lellenberg hosted the convention, and the program contains Peter's article about William Gillette's playlet "The Painful Predicament of Sherlock Holmes". What a fascinating piece of ephemera!

Folks who didn't make the meeting lost out on the chance to win some wonderful door prizes. The star of the prizes was a one-of-a-kind Sherlockian plaque from Julie Snell's collection, donated by her daughter, Nancy Anselm. After a delicious lunch, we settled in for our speaker's Zoom presentation. Harrison "Terry" Hunt is a retired history museum curator and is invested in the Baker Street Irregulars as "The Something Hunt". He spoke about "That Dreadful Chasm—Alternatives to the Canonical Narrative of the Fateful Day at the Reichenbach Falls". Terry's arguments for re-interpreting Dr. Watson's account of the incidents at Reichenbach were persuasive and illuminating. He opened the audiences' minds to the question of the role of the Swiss boy, to the reasons Colonel Moran took certain actions at the Falls, and to Moran's decision to keep 221B Baker Street under surveillance during the time that Holmes resurfaced among the living.
