On Saturday, December 14th, The Red Circle celebrated the holidays by sailing down the Nile. . .at Washington's venerable Arena Stage. Almost 60 of us gathered to see the world premiere production of Ken Ludwig's adaptation of Agatha Christie's *Death on the Nile*—a not-to-be-missed staging of a classic mystery. The production was held in Arena's Kreeger Theatre, where the audience was treated to an exciting, funny, and occasionally touching play. At the request of the Christie estate, Ken Ludwig penned this fast-moving and thrilling



script, punctuated by his trademark humor. The characters are deftly drawn, and his clever use of comedy provides much-needed relief from the tension inherent in the plot of a

murder mystery All the actors performed brilliantly, especially Armando Durán as detective Hercule Poirot, and newcomer Olivia Cygan as spoiled heiress Linnet Ridgeway. The sets were beautifully conceived, evoking the glamor and elegance of the period. The costumes? Oh, the costumes! Evening gowns in glorious cuts and fabrics, true to the courtier styles of the 1930s, elevated the appearance of luxury and extravagance.
